

Walter Dorwin Teague Art Deco Blue Mirror Sparton Radio Reference:

This American art deco radio was designed by Walter Dorwin Teague (1883 – 1960) for the Sparks-Worthington Company, Jackson, Michigan and introduced in 1936. It was produced until 1940. The radio, known as the "sled" is a marvel of art deco streamline style. Three ebonized wood bands on the left and five chromed bands on the right encase a body of cobalt blue mirror. The radio is $8 \frac{3}{4}$ " x $17 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $8 \frac{3}{8}$ " and is in excellent condition.
